

7-petal crochet flower



This produces an 8-cm (3 inches) flower. The purpose is to leave a “big” hole in the middle, so you can use it over a button or — if you want to be really creative — as a changeable embellishment for beanies, hats or whatever. ☺ So, instead of crocheting or sewing the flower directly onto your work, try sewing on a button and crochet several flowers in different colors. This way, you’ll have the same piece that changes according to your mood, your clothes, your inspiration… Enjoy!

6,5 mm/ K hook

Worsted yarn (6 meters/20 feet — WOW! This is something, isn’t it? 6 meters for a flower?)

Gauge: What?

Row 1: Chain 6, slip stitch to the beginning of the chain to form a circle.

Row 2: chain 1 (does not count as a sc), 13 sc into the circle. Sl st into chain 1.

Row 3: *chain 3, skip 1 sc, sl st into next stitch* 7 times. On the last chain, sl st into the 1st chain.

Row 4: sl st into the first chain 3, *chain 3, 4 dc, sl st into the chain 3, sl st into the next chain 3* 7 times = 7 petals. On the last petal, sl st into the chain and then into the sl st into the first petal. Fasten off and finish off.
